Slavery & Human Trafficking Statement 2018/19

Modern slavery is a crime and a violation of fundamental human rights. It takes various forms, such as slavery, servitude, forced and compulsory labour and human trafficking, all of which have in common the deprivation of a person's liberty by another in order to exploit them for personal or commercial gain.

We are committed to improving our practices to combat slavery and human trafficking.

This statement is published on behalf of Braemar Shipping Services plc and its subsidiary companies (together "Braemar") pursuant to section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and constitutes our slavery and human trafficking statement for the financial year ended 28 February 2019.

In 2017, we carried out a review of our policies and procedures to determine whether those policies effectively identify and help us to tackle modern slavery issues. We have continued to monitor our policies and procedures since then and have not identified any instances of slavery or human trafficking. We started a fuller review of our policies and procedures in the financial year ending 28 February 2019, which included a consideration of the potential risks of slavery and human trafficking taking place in our supply chains and business. These matters will also feature in a new training programme that is being implemented.

DUE DILIGENCE PROCESSES FOR SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING

As part of our initiative to identify and mitigate risk we have reflected the requirements of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 in our policies and procedures and in our working documents. We are refreshing and implementing new versions of certain internal policies and procedures to mitigate any risk of slavery and human trafficking within our supply chains and to ensure those procedures allow us to identify any risks.

We have a policy to protect whistle blowers who highlight to us any risk of slavery or human trafficking within our business.

NEXT STEPS

We continue to develop and improve our onboarding policies and procedures and to ensure that they have appropriate measures in place to mitigate the risks of modern slavery and human trafficking in our business and that our staff are appropriately trained to be alert to such risks.

We will continue to review the effectiveness of the steps we have taken to ensure that there is no slavery or human trafficking in our business.
